Healthier Washington Grant Budget Available

Upon conclusion of budget negotiations with the Center for Medicaid and Medicare Innovation (CMMI), Healthier Washington has released an overview of its \$65 million grant budget. Below is a breakdown by investment area and Year 1. Healthier Washington will go through an annual non-competitive approval process with CMMI. At this time only the Year 1 budget is approved.
