



Vaccinations available with the Washington Prescription Drug Program Discount Card

As a Discount Card member, you don't need a doctor's appointment to get vaccinated. Many Washington pharmacies offer immunizations and vaccines to Discount Card members. However, not every pharmacy is equipped to administer all vaccines, so be sure to call your local pharmacy and ask if they administer the vaccine(s) you need.

As a Discount Card member your cost to have the vaccine administered is around \$20. In addition to the \$20 fee* Card members are responsible for the discounted vaccine cost, the pharmacy dispensing fee, and a vaccine network fee.

Eligible immunizations and vaccines for Discount Card members include:

Haemophilus Influenzae B (HIB)	Acthib, Hibtiter, Pedvax HIB
Hepatitis A & B	Twinrix
Human Papillomavirus (HPV)	Gardasil and Cervarix
Influenza	Fluzone, Flumist
Japanese Encephalitis	Ixiaro
Measels, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)	Proquad
Meningococcal,	Menomune, Menactra, Menveo
Pneumococcal (Pneumonia)	Pneumonvax 23
Polio	Ipol
Rabies	Imovax, Rabavert, Hyperrab SD, Imogam Rabies
Shingles (Herpes Zoster)	Zostavax
Tetanus, Diphtheria (Td) and Pertussis (Tdap)	Tenivac
Typhoid	Typhim VI, Typhoid
Varicella (Chicken Pox)	Varivax
Yellow Fever	YF-Vax

*Please note that the \$20 administrative fee is waived for most influenza vaccines, with the exception of high dosage influenza vaccines, and you can find out what the vaccine cost will be by going to "Drug Prices" at www.hca.wa.gov/pdp.
